Dear Volunteer Coaches:

We wanted to take a moment to welcome you to our 3 on 3 Youth Hockey League and appreciate the support and guidance that you will be providing our young players. This year we need your assistance with ensuring the safety and well-being of our participants. As with all youth sports organizations, including Hockey Canada, we now require Criminal Background Checks to be done by all of our volunteers who assist with the youth in our programs and leagues.

We want to ensure that you, as a coach, are protected as well as our organization. A criminal background check is now a standard within youth sports to protect children from violent actions, general abuse, sexual abuse, emotional abuse, neglect or possible exposure to socially improper behaviors.

Canlan Ice Sports is committed to providing a safe and enjoyable environment. The absence of relevant criminal record(s) or criminal charge(s) is a genuine job-related requirement for Positions of Authority or Trust and Canlan will not engage or retain the services of individuals with improper backgrounds. This not only protects you, but also your children.

In order to protect yourself and our league we have provided the following options for you:

- a. **Option #1:** Go to your local police department and request a Criminal Background Check for a volunteer. Where necessary, Canlan Ice Sports can provide you a letter indicating your role and requesting the check be done. Many Police offices can run the check and create the letter of clearance while you wait. Others may take some time to process your request. Please send an email to the Program Manager or submit written confirmation that the request has been submitted with your local Police. Once acquiring a clearance report from your local Police office, the official document must remain with Canlan Ice Sports, but a copy can be produced for your use with other volunteer organizations. All personal information is confidential and secure.
- b. **Option #2:** If you do not have the time to get to your local police department there is another simple alternative. We have acquired the services of a company called Backcheck (used by Hockey Canada). To use this service you must visit your Canlan Ice Sports facility and fill out the appropriate paperwork to have your information sent directly to Backcheck. The cost for this service is TBA and varies among the communities. This service company will provide us a notation of "clear". You will not have a formal report to be used with other organizations.

In both instances the clearance information received will not need to be updated for **three years** and no matter which option you choose your Privacy of Information will be protected.

Our Canlan Ice Sports facility will not retain any copies in our local files but we will make a note as to when you received your clearance. The copy we do receive will be filed with our Chief Privacy Officer.

Once again, we sincerely thank you for your assistance and we hope to see you for many years to come. The children on your team appreciate your guidance, as do the parents and our staff at Canlan Ice Sports. Coaching children is a special gift and we are thankful to have caring volunteers such as yourself.

Canlan Ice Sports – Youth League Code of Conduct

COACHES CODE OF CONDUCT

- Winning is a consideration, but not the only one, nor the most important one. Care more about the players than winning the game.
- Be a positive role model to your players, display emotional maturity and be alert to the physical safety of players.
- Be generous with your praise when it is deserved; be consistent, honest; be fair and just; do not criticize players publicly; learn to be a more effective communicator and coach; do not yell at players.
- Adjust to personal needs and problems of players, be a good listener, never verbally or physically abuse a player or official; give all players the opportunity to improve their skills, gain confidence and develop self-esteem; teach them the basics.
- Organize practices that are fun and challenging for your players. Familiarize yourself with the rules, techniques and strategies of the sport; encourage all your players to be team players.
- Maintain an open line of communication with your players' parents. Explain the goals and objectives of your association.
- Be concerned with the overall development of your players. Stress good health habits and clean living.
- To play the game is great; to love the game is greater.

PLAYERS CODE OF CONDUCT

- Play for FUN.
- Work hard to improve your skills.
- Be a team player - get along with your teammates.
- Learn teamwork, sportsmanship and discipline.
- Be on time for practices and games.
- Learn the rules and play by them. Always be a good sport.
- Respect your coach, your teammates, your parents, opponents and officials.
- Never argue with an official's decision.

PARENTS CODE OF CONDUCT

- Do not force your children to participate in sports, but support their desires to play their chosen sport. Children are involved in organized sports for their enjoyment. Make it fun.
- Encourage your child to play by the rules. Remember, children learn best by example, so applaud the good plays of both teams.
- Do not embarrass your child by yelling at players, coaches or officials. By showing a positive attitude toward the game and all of its participants, your child will benefit.
- Emphasize skill development and practices and how they benefit your young athlete. De-emphasize games and competition in lower age groups.
- Know and study the rules of the game, and support the officials on and off the playing surface. This approach will help in the development and support of the game. Any criticism of the officials only hurts the game.
- Applaud a good effort in victory and in defeat and enforce the positive points of the game. Never yell or physically abuse your child after a game or practice-it is destructive. Work toward removing the physical and verbal abuse in youth sports.
- Recognize the importance of volunteer coaches. They are important to the development of your child and the sport. Communicate with them and support them.
- If you enjoy the game, learn all you can about the game, and volunteer!

Youth Hockey Equipment List

Jock (Boys) or Jill (Girls)

Garter Belt	To hold socks in place
Hockey Shin Pads	Should fit snug around the knee and be long enough to cover the top of the skates
Hockey Socks	Should fit comfortably over the shin pads without restricting mobility
Hockey Pants	Should be long enough to overlap the shin pads by inches and high enough for kidney and lower back protection; may be held up by a belt or suspenders
Hockey Skates	Should fit snug and provide good ankle support – DO NOT buy oversized skates
Hockey Shoulder Pads	Should fit snug around the shoulder and provide good protection for the shoulders, chest and upper back
Hockey Elbow Pads	Should fit snug around the elbow and be long enough to meet the glove
Neck Guard	Must be BNQ approved
Hockey Jersey	Should fit comfortably over the shoulder and elbow pads without restricting mobility
Hockey Helmet	Must have a chin strap and full face mask (metal cage or plastic shield) and be CSA approved
Hockey Gloves	Should fit snug and allow good finger and hand mobility
Hockey Stick	Should be cut to length to fit between a player's chest and chin when wearing skates
Mouth Guard	Recommended, but not mandatory - For protecting teeth and to prevent concussions
